Pharmacy First

Did you know you can now attend a pharmacy for 7 common conditions without the need to contact your GP first. You GP will refer you directly if you were to contact them with one of the 7 conditions listed below, you can save a call and present directly to the pharmacy too. The pharmacist will assess your condition and provide advice and treatment where required.

Conditions they can offer prescription medicine for are:

•impetigo (aged 1 year and over)

•infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)

•earache (aged 1 to 17 years)

•sore throat (aged 5 years and over)

•sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)

•urinary tract infections (UTIs) (women aged 16 to 64 years)

•shingles (aged 18 years and over)

The Pharmacist can also offer advice for a wide range of common conditions outside of those listed.

When to Call the GP Surgery for an Appointment

Urgent Duty Doctor Appointments

If you have a medical concern that needs same-day attention but is not a life-threatening emergency, you may need an urgent duty doctor appointment. Call the surgery **as early as possible** in the morning to request one or book online. These appointments are reserved for conditions that cannot wait for a routine appointment, such as:

Severe infections
Worsening long-term conditions
High fever in children
Sudden or severe pain

Once capacity is full please consider local pharmacies, NHS 111 or the walk-in centre

For **life-threatening emergencies**, always call **999** or visit **A&E** immediately.

Routine Appointments

Routine appointments are for non-urgent issues, including: •Long-term condition reviews (e.g., diabetes, asthma) •Medication reviews •General health concerns that are not urgent •Follow-up appointments

These can often be booked in advance by phone, online, or at the reception desk.

If you are unsure which appointment you need, our reception team can guide you.
